"It is my pleasure to discuss my role and experiences with Coolmine since I took up my position as Coolmine Mid-West manager in 2020.

The last year has brought plenty of excitement, challenges and change. Coolmine delighted to be allocated funding to provide residential support to mothers impacted by addiction in the Mid-West by the HSE. This funding came from Coolmine identifying the high numbers of mothers presenting to Ashleigh house over the last number of years from the south and Mid-West of Ireland. In addition to the this, the MWRDAF were involved with a research piece, "We Would be Stronger" that highlighted the prevalence of trauma and addiction for Woman presenting from the Limerick City Area. Limerick City, a city I grew up in, has unique challenges. While the are communities strong and the people humorous and resilient. it is clear that deprivation and disadvantage disproportionately impacts on the city overall. The consequences to this disadvantage is the high prevalence of trauma which often results in addiction.

Women in particular face a range of barriers to accessing supports, these barriers are often in the form of stigma and shame. We, as a community need to break down these barriers and provide supports to enable women and mothers to break the cycle of addiction. I am delighted to be associated with Coolmine and in particular the 'Coolmine Way' to do our utmost to provide this support. We have a great team in Coolmine, from the top down, and the ethos of believing in peoples' capacity to overcome addiction is alive in all the staff. The Staff here in Limerick are a pleasure to work with - a new team has formed which works well together and most importantly strives everyday to support people who are suffering from addiction.

Coolmine believes strongly in evidence base practices but ultimately it is relationships that Coolmine really believes in; relationships with staff, external services, funders and most importantly building trust and relationships with clients and the community.

We have come a long way in a short time in Limerick and we are looking forward to establishing the residential unit to provide a comprehensive wraparound service for mothers and children impacted by addition. So, very exciting times in Coolmine and I am looking forward to developing and growing the service in the Mid-West while maintaining a core 'Coolmine Feel' to the services.

It is great to see the staff here in Limerick - who are managed brilliantly by Bernie and Louise - provide such a range of supports. Any day can be different. The team have embraced the need to provide positive outlets for people, we know that structure, routine and a sense of purpose are major contributors to the recovery process. It is wonderful to see many females engage in the pro-socials ranging from yoga, boot camp to fish and chips!! The service has contributed positively to the lives of many people already in the Mid-West. In addition to the expansion in the Mid-West, I am delighted to see the Coolmine Service being delivered in the Southwest by the excellent Dr. Eoin Coughlan (I am jealous of the Dr title) and his really good team of team leaders.

I enjoy working with the management team of Javier, Eoin, Anita and Paul and Lisa; a great support, highly motivated but very approachable. We have a culture of support here in Coolmine, issues are resolved and we move on. Trust is seen from the management and board down through the organisation.

One thing that has stood out for me is that you're a "Coolminer for life"

LIAM'S STORY

"I graduated in 1987, after finally putting my head and feelings totally into the programme. At that time the programme was in St. Martha's, Navan. I first came into Coolmine in 1976 but on numerous occasions I split. Thankfully the staff kept faith with me. After graduation I went to work outside the programme and in 1989 I was asked to be a staff member and worked in the lodge for 4 years.

What my recovery means to me is that I totally respect myself and others. Whenever something for me goes wrong, the biggest being when my partner died from cancer which threw my life upside down, but it was the strength I learned from Coolmine that kept me straight as so many times I nearly failed.

I have the utmost respect for Coolmine. I would never let anybody run it down. I have great friends from it, and my peer group we visited the lodge for our 30th anniversary. I would like to tell the residents that if you put your self totally into the programme it works. I'm 65 now I was 18 when I was in contact with Coolmine. Believe me it works.

The journey of a thousand miles begins with the first step."
